# **Education Assistance for children** tutoring

**Defence Community Organisation** 

# The education of a member's child may be disrupted if the child changes school due to posting in Australia. The intent of <u>tutoring</u> <u>services</u> is to help the child meet the academic standards of the new school.

# WHAT'S AVAILABLE

To overcome <u>immediate</u> difficulties as a result of posting, reimbursement for the cost of face-to-face and web-base tutoring is available, where the child requires tutoring that the <u>school cannot provide</u>.

### ELIGIBILITY

- The member is granted a removal to a new posting location.
- The member has a child changing school to the gaining location.
- The child is under 20 years old.
- The child normally lives with the member or adult dependant.
- The child requires tutoring that the school cannot provide.

- The child is not repeating a school year to improve results.
- The Principal or the child's teacher at the new school certifies that the child has not reached, or is unlikely to maintain, a sufficient standard in a subject.
- The child attends a registered primary or secondary school full-time.

# FACE-TO-FACE TUTORING

A member who buys face-to-face tutoring for their child:

- may be reimbursed for one hour of tutoring a week for each subject.
- reimbursement must be no more than \$96 an hour

#### WEB-BASED TUTORING

- A member may be reimbursed for the cost of a subscription to a web-based tutoring service that the member chooses.
- Please refer to the calculation table over page (Ref: PACMAN 8.4.11)



#### Calculation

Step	Action
1.	Find the maximum limit for the child and the certified subject in the table in subsection 6.
2.	<ul> <li>Find the number of subjects that meet both these requirements.</li> <li>a. The subject was certified by the child's new school under paragraph 8.4.9.c.</li> <li>b. The child is provided with online tuition on the subject.</li> <li>See: Section 8.4.9, Member this Division applies to</li> </ul>
3.	Multiply the outcome of Step 1 by the outcome of Step 2.
4.	Find the amount paid to the member for any face-to-face tutoring under section 8.4.10. <b>See:</b> Section 8.4.10, Face-to-face tutoring
5.	Subtract the outcome of Step 4 from the outcome of Step 3.
6.	The outcome of Step 5 is the limit that may be reimbursed for web-based tutoring.

### **CONDITIONS FOR REIMBURSEMENT**

For the member to be reimbursed their costs, the tutoring service must be provided:

- within 18 months of the child starting study at the new school
- by a qualified person or accredited organisation
- reimbursement will be undertaken following receipt of correctly rendered invoices.
